

HOW DO I REGISTER TO VOTE?

You can register in person at your local County Auditor or County Elections Office. Or you can complete and mail a "Mail-in-Voter Registration Form" provided by the Washington Secretary of State. Justice Works! can provide this form if needed.

WHAT ARE THE DEADLINES?

In person at the local elections office

- If you are a new voter, you may register to vote eight days prior to an election;
- If you are updating your voter registration information, you must do it thirty days prior to an election

By mail or online:

- The deadline is twenty nine days before an election
- Changes to residential address, name, or other voter registration record information must be made before this deadline. If the deadline is not met, voters may still vote using their previous voter registration record information.
- The registration must be postmarked no later than the deadline.

RESTORED VOTING RIGHTS

FOR PEOPLE WITH LEGAL FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS IN WASHINGTON STATE

As of July 27, 2009

A new law has removed the prohibition against voting in Washington State for people who have outstanding legal financial obligations due to felony convictions.

To register to vote in Washington state you must be:

- A citizen of the United States;
- A legal resident of Washington;
- 18 years old on election day.

You may not register to vote if you are:

- Currently incarcerated with a state or federal felony conviction;
- Currently reporting to Washington State DOC Community Corrections;
- Determined to have willfully failed to make three Washington State Legal Financial Obligation payments in a 12 month period;
- Judicially declared mentally incompetent and not allowed to vote.
